North Carolina Facts

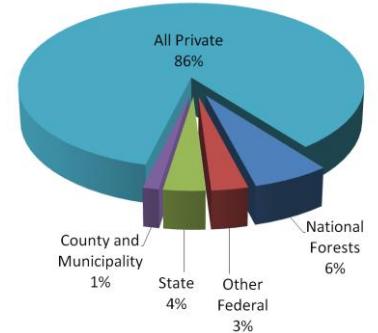
- **Wood** delivered to the sawmills represents over \$762.5 million in 2010, down 18% from 2009.
- **Forestry, logging, and wood products manufacturing** contributes \$10.9 billion to NC's 2008 economy.
- **Pulpwood** is the leading wood product in NC, with 258 million cubic feet cut in 2009.
- **Saw-log output** is next at 254 million cubic feet cut in 2009.
- **Veneer logs / composite** are third largest at 39 million cubic feet cut in 2009.

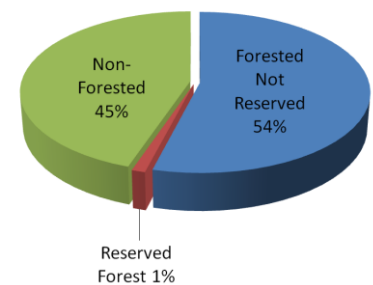
