Pulpwood Prices in North Carolina Surged Back in the 2020 Second Quarter



According to TimberMart-South, while state-wide average pine sawtimber prices dropped slightly due primarily to the limited logging and sawmill operations, both pine and hardwood pulpwood prices surged substantially compared to the previous quarter. Pine pulpwood prices were averaged at \$9.1 per ton, up about 22% from the first quarter of 2020. Similarly, hardwood pulpwood prices were also up approximately 168% to \$6.5/ton. The dramatically higher demand for tissue products amidst the Pandemic could be the main reason behind these sharp rises in pulpwood prices. The annual national report of the Forest Health Monitoring (FHM) program of the Forest Service presents forest health status and trends from a national or multi-State regional perspective using a variety of sources. In this report, national survey data are used to identify recent geographic patterns of insect and disease activity and satellite data are employed to detect geographic patterns of forest fire occurrence.
