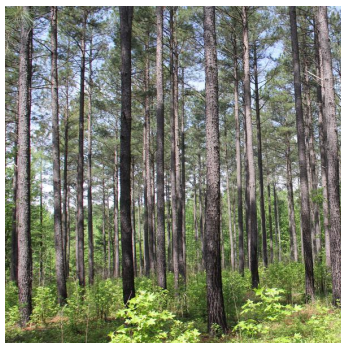

Rural Forest Markets Act

The bipartisan Rural Forests Markets Act was recently introduced by U.S. Senators Debbie Stabenow (D-Mich.) and Mike Braun (R-Ind.). This act will establish an investment program that will offer a federal loan guarantee up to \$150 million to cover upfront costs for developing small-scale forest carbon projects.
